

EQUESTRIAN SERVICES TIP OF THE MONTH

BE CAREFUL GRAZING YOUR HORSES IN THE TALL LUSH GRASS

FIDDLENECK - POISONOUS PLANT TOXIC TO HORSES





While this time of year brings lush green hills to the Hidden Hills community, please be aware of the potentially toxic plants that are often lurking among the tall grass. Normally not seen in Hidden Hills, Fiddleneck is one of the many plants that can be toxic to horses and can easily be mistaken for a Mustard plant.

Fiddleneck weed, also known as Amsinckia, is a common weed found in many parts of North America and can be particularly harmful to horses if ingested. Fiddleneck can grow up to two feet tall. Its leaves are long and narrow, and they have a rough, sandpapery texture. The plant has small, trumpet-shaped flowers that are typically yellow or orange, and they bloom in late spring or early summer.

Why Fiddleneck Weed is Harmful to Horses:

Fiddleneck weed contains a toxin called pyrrolizidine alkaloids (PAs). When horses consume this weed, the PAs can cause liver damage, which can be fatal. Ingesting just a small amount of fiddleneck weed can be harmful to horses, and repeated exposure can lead to chronic liver disease.

If a horse does ingest fiddleneck weed, it is important to contact a veterinarian immediately. There is no specific antidote for fiddleneck weed poisoning.

Please inspect any areas before you allow your horse to graze to avoid ingestion.




