2022-2023 ASSESSMENTS

At its meeting of May 17, 2022, the Board of Directors voted to keep the assessment rate the same as the last several years, \$.25 per \$100 of assessed valuation. Assessment invoices will be mailed out shortly. There are a few very important things you need to know:

If you have received a Decline in Valuation from the assessor, please send it to us right away. Per the CC&Rs, only those Declines in Valuation that are dated September 13, 2022 or earlier will be used for the 2022-23 assessment. There will be no adjustments made (nor refunds issued) for Declines in Valuation obtained after that date.

As a courtesy, this year we will be emailing invoices as well as sending them through snail mail, so please also verify that your email address in DwellingLIVE is correct. We will use the contact information associated with the person marked "Owner" in your property profile.

The following is a list of fast and convenient ways to make your assessment payment.

No Cost Option:

Check, made payable to Hidden Hills Community Association. Mailed or dropped off at the association office at the community center.

Credit Card through QuickBooks, a 3% fee will be added to all credit transactions. We accept Mastercard, Visa, American Express and Discover.

ACH Payment through QuickBooks, a 1% fee will be added to all transactions.

Your Bank Bill Pay System, enter your bill and pay online. Please reference the invoice number and property address on your payment.

Wire Transfer, contact **Stefany@hiddenhills.org** for details and wiring instructions.

PLEASE NOTE: you are responsible to pay your assessments whether you receive the invoice(s) or not. If you do not receive your invoice by the end of October, please call the office and request a duplicate. Assessments are due on November 10, 2022, and late if not received or postmarked by December 10, 2022. Late payments will result in a 10% penalty and 12% interest (APR) until paid, so make sure you pay your assessments on time.

DURING OUR RAINY SEASON, PLEASE MAKE SURE YOUR HORSES HAVE SHELTER FROM THE RAIN. CLEAN ("PICK") THE SOLES OF THEIR FEET PERIODICALLY TO BE SURE WET FEET WILL NOT BECOME A BREEDING GROUND FOR THRUSH.

ALSO, CHECK YOUR DRAINAGE TO MAKE SURE YOUR STALLS AND TURNOUTS DON'T FLOOD AND YOUR RAINGUTTERS ARE CLEARED FROM DEBRIS.

SAFETY AROUND HORSES

Horses are part of the landscape here in Hidden Hills, and have been for more than sixty years. Whether you are walking your dog, riding a bike, skateboarding, pushing a stroller or driving by in a car, there are things we all can do to make interactions between horses and people engaging in other activities safer.

Horses do not like surprises, and they do not like loud noises or sudden movements, especially if the motion is coming towards them from any direction. Pedestrians and people on bicycles and skateboards should slow their pace when within about forty feet of a horse. It is also very helpful (not to mention neighborly) to say hello or otherwise verbally announce your presence. If the horse appears nervous, by spinning around, snorting or prancing, or if the rider or horse handler indicates to you that they are having problems controlling their horse, please help prevent an accident by stopping your forward motion towards the horse. A frightened horse can be very dangerous, both to itself as well as to the people and property around it. Usually, once the horse realizes that it is a person and not something to be afraid of that is approaching it, it will calm down. At that point, you can ask the horse handler if it is okay to proceed. A special note to dog owners – if your dog is reactive to horses, please make sure to maintain a safe distance from all horses, including those horses you may pass that are at home in their paddocks.

When driving in our community, drivers should slow down when approaching and passing horses, and give them a wide berth, especially when horses are on the street. Drivers should be aware that equestrians are often forced to be on the roadway because of cars on the parkway, or in construction areas, where loud equipment and activity can startle horses.

Drivers should always be alert for horses, especially when going over speed bumps and around corners- please slow down, and do not veer towards the dirt parkway to go around speed bumps- again, loud noises and the sudden approach of your vehicle can scare nearby horses and cause an accident.

Drivers should be aware that they have a legal obligation to follow the instruction of riders or handlers of horses, per California Vehicle Code 21759:

"The driver of any vehicle approaching any horse drawn vehicle, any ridden animal, or any livestock shall exercise proper control of his vehicle and shall reduce speed or stop as may appear necessary or as may be signaled or otherwise requested by any person driving, riding or in charge of the animal or livestock in order to avoid frightening and to safeguard the animal or livestock and to insure the safety of any person driving or riding the animal or in charge of the livestock."


