

EQUESTRIAN SERVICES TIP OF THE MONTH

LOOKING OUT FOR, AND TREATING, A "STREET NAIL" IN OUR HORSES

HELPFUL TIPS FOR YOU & YOUR HORSE

Lately, it seems to be "raining" rusty nails and "foreign bodies" on our parkways and trails. With all the construction in our community, we're even finding them in our driveways. So are our horses!

Knowing the dangers, it's a good idea to check your horses' feet daily, especially after a walk or a ride. Naturally occurring foreign bodies such as rocks and sticks, and now . . . nails, wires, and screws, can become lodged in your horses' feet; it's a dangerous condition that may be calling out for an immediate vet visit. Sticks and rocks can get wedged next to the frog and cause bruising, while things like nails and screws can cause very serious puncture wounds.

What to do if you find a nail in your horse's foot:

If you find a nail that is flush with the bottom of your horse's foot, and not in danger of being pushed in any further, veterinarians recommend that you leave it in place and call them out immediately. The vet can then take an x-ray to see exactly how far the object penetrated the foot, and if any critical structures such as a joint capsule or tendon sheath have been compromised. This will help the veterinarian determine an appropriate treatment plan. There is a very real danger of serious infection when these structures have been compromised.

If the nail or other foreign object could likely be pushed further into your horse's foot, you must remove it. Take a photo from a couple of different angles before removing it, and if you have a permanent marker handy, circle the point of entry on the foot and mark a notch on the object where it entered the foot, so you will have an idea of how deeply it penetrated. As soon as the object is removed, the tissues surrounding the wound will swell, trapping infection-causing materials and making the point of entry harder to see. Clean the foot with a dry brush, and immediately apply disinfectant

(such as Betadine) to the area. Do not soak the foot unless the wound has been thoroughly cleaned (otherwise, you will end up allowing dirty water to potentially travel into the puncture wound, further contaminating it). After cleaning and treating with disinfectant, apply a foot wrap to keep the area clean and dry until your vet arrives.



Plan ahead! Puncture wounds are dangerous business for horses because of their susceptibility to Tetanus. Make sure that your horses are current on their Tetanus vaccine! And monitor your properties, the parkways and trails near your homes where you ride. With all the construction going on, it's raining rusty nails and screws all around us!

We hope these tips help you and yours stay safe and happy!






