

TIP OF THE MONTH HOT WEATHER CARE TIPS FOR OUR CREATURES

(ALSO APPLIES TO HUMANS!)




WATER – If possible, place water containers in the shade. (Even when they are in the shade, they will heat up during the day, so always check the temperature of the water.) Water that is too warm will discourage animals from drinking enough. You can dump out some or all of their water and add fresh cool water as needed- use the warm water for your plants! It should go without saying, but it is also important that water is available at all times and is clean.

Special note for horse owners: Making sure that your horses have access to salt every day can encourage them to stay well hydrated in the heat (and hopefully avoid colic). Many horses do well with free choice salt, but some do better with a small amount offered every day. (Do not add salt to their water. Try adding a small amount to their hay.)

AUTOMATIC WATERERS - The above also holds true for automatic waterers. Make sure that the water coming out is not hot, which can happen if the pipe bringing in water is in the sun or along a hot wall or roof. Also, get in the habit of checking the automatic waterers daily to make sure they are working properly.

SHELTER - Make sure all animals have a shady place to get out of the sun, and be sure that shade is available throughout the day.

EXERCISE - Try to plan exercise events for the mornings if possible, since this is the coolest time of the day. Dogs in particular do not handle heat well, since they only have sweat glands in their paws. (Their primary method of cooling is through panting and vasodilation.) Another factor to consider is the heat of the ground - always feel the ground/



FLIES - Biting flies and other insects can make our animals (and us!) miserable. There are several things that you can do to help. Keep your animals' living quarters as clean and dry as possible, and make sure animal waste is regularly discarded in covered containers. Flies love a still, moist environment, so fans can really help.

Special note for horse owners: Use fly repellents, fly masks and fly sheets as needed, and make sure that they are kept clean and in good working order. For horses that are extremely sensitive to biting insects, also consider trying feed supplements designed to make your horse undesirable to flies. And make sure your horses are current on their West Nile Virus vaccines - the mosquitoes are out in force these days!

FANS – For animals that are housed outside, fans can provide relief from insects as well as a cooling breeze. Make sure that the fans are rated for outside use and that your animals cannot tip them over or chew the cord.

Special note for horse owners: The number one cause of barn fires in the summer is inexpensive box fans. Since these fans are designed for indoor use, their motors are not sealed, which means that dust and moisture can get inside, causing them to overheat and ultimately cause a fire. If you have fans in your barn, be sure they are designed for outdoor use and that the motors are sealed. Search for industrial, agricultural or barn fans. Also important, make sure that your horses cannot reach the electrical cord!



WHAT'S LEAKING???

Here's a quick tip from one of your neighbors

For all of you who are shocked at the amount of water you are using and are dealing with the current water emergency, there's a tool that can help. If you have one of the "new" water meters installed at your house (most of you do), go to https://lvmwd.watersmart.com/index.php/welcome and register to use the WATERSMART tool that is available with detailed information of how much water you use on an hour-by-hour basis!

At 4am (and 5am and 6am) when I was sound asleep and there were no sprinklers running, I was using 4 gallons of water PER HOUR! That's almost 100 gallons every day! I checked all the toilets. Nothing. Then I walked around and looked at all the sprinkler valves, hose bibs, etc. and SURPRISE! Leaks, leaks and more leaks. Mostly worn washers (fairly easy to fix) and a couple of dribbling valves (a little tougher, but no big deal). Then, buried under some bushes (and directly adjacent to the foundation of my house!!!!) I discovered a muddy mess. One call to the plumber and a couple of hundred dollars later and presto! My Watersmart graph now shows under 1 gal is being used (pretty sure that means none). **Check it out:**


