Dear Residents,



EQUESTRIAN SERVICES TIP OF THE MONTH HEY! HAVE YOU CHECKED YOUR HAY LATELY?

HELPFUL TIPS FOR YOU & YOUR HORSE

This is the time of year when we need to be especially aware of the quality of our hay. Throughout the year we have to be on the lookout for things that are not supposed to be mixed in our horses' hay, such as rocks, foxtails and other sharp, barbed plant materials and the occasional dead animal. Moisture is always a concern when dealing with hay. At this time of year, when it is cool and damp, there are even more opportunities for moisture to damage hay, though improperly handled hay can contain mold at any time of the year. To add to the challenge, sometimes these issues will not be obvious on the outside of the bale, or even present in every bale of a particular delivery.

Whoever feeds horses their hay must always be on the lookout. Molds can cause respiratory problems in both horses and humans, as well as colic in horses. Barbed plant materials can become imbedded in horses' mouths and also cause colic. Invasive plants mixed in with the hay can range from being merely unpalatable to toxic, and may or may not cause your horse to stop eating the hay.

What can you do? Become familiar with what your hay normally looks and smells like. There will be variations from load to load and throughout the year. Sometimes the outer edges of bales will be sun-bleached, but this is not considered unhealthy. Try to buy hay and begin feeding from the new delivery before you are completely out of your previous delivery, so that if there is a problem with your new hay, you don't have to scramble to find more hay. It should go without saying, but your hay storage area should be rain and moisture-proof, and hay should always be stored up off of the ground and protected from contamination by rodents and other animals.

What should you look for? Good hay should not have large amounts of other types of plants mixed in, or **any** amount of sharp or questionable plant material. Normal hay should not ever feel warm or damp inside the bale when it is opened. If mold is found within a bale, consider the entire bale contaminated and do not use any of it. Hay should never be damp or excessively dusty, smell at all musty or moldy, and should not have clumps within it that are discolored and matted. Do not ever feed your horse questionable hay- it is not worth the risk!

If you find any of these issues present, contact your supplier and explain what you found. Work with them to find a solution- bad hay is a headache for them too. If they want you to throw away the bad hay, make sure to dispose of it in a place where other animals won't have access to it, ideally in your covered manure bin.

Your horses are depending on you to keep them safe!




