## EQUESTRIAN SERVICES TIP OF THE MONTH

# CARING FOR HORSES IN COLD/WET WEATHER

### HELPFUL TIPS FOR YOU & YOUR HORSE

#### Shelter

Make sure your horses always have access to shelter where they can stay dry and out of the wind. Provide adequate bedding, so that your horses have a dry place to lie down. Clean out rain gutters and create drainage channels to keep water from flooding barn areas. Use products such as CedaRest, Dry Stall, or wood pellets to help control muddy areas. Consider blanketing, especially for horses that are older or thin. Blankets, when properly applied, can help horses conserve calories and avoid getting chilled if they lie down on wet ground.

#### Water

Make sure that your horse always has access to clean fresh water. When our temperatures drop into the 30's and 40's, consider adding a bucket of hot water to large water containers to encourage them to drink more- optimal drinking water temperature for horses is about 55 degrees.

#### Salt

Make sure that your horse always has access to salt. For horses that tend to consume too much when given a salt block, provide them with 1-2 tablespoons per day- ideally free choice, and never in their water.

#### Food

Consuming hay generates heat and helps to keep horses warm. Consider providing additional hay for older or underweight horses to help keep them warm and maintain their condition.

#### Health issues related to cold wet weather

Colic is common in colder weather, when many horses don't drink enough to keep up with their digestive needs. Make sure that your horse is still getting some exercise on a regular basis, even if it is just going for a walk.

Pay close attention to horse's feet and skin, especially their lower legs when it has been wet - thrush and scratches (a skin infection also known as "rain rot") are common problems this time of the year. Regular grooming and hoof cleaning can prevent most issues, and will help you catch any problems early, when they are easier to treat!
